

RMTAO 2024 Fee Survey Results



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The Registered Massage Therapists' Association of Ontario (RMTAO) conducted a fee survey to get an idea of the customary rates currently charged by RMTs across Ontario. This survey, in addition to the rate of inflation and previous member surveys and feedback, will be used to offer RMTs further guidance on setting fees.

RMTs in Ontario independently set rates/fees for their practice, and those fees are not regulated. The Fee Survey results are intended as a recommendation for RMTs looking for guidance and is intended to provide a benchmark against which massage therapists can begin to develop their own fee schedule. There are many factors that an RMT can consider when developing their fee schedule, including but not limited to, the average fee for treatment in their area.

The survey was open from February 8, 2024, to February 23, 2024. The survey was sent to 6941 RMTAO members and there was a total of 1,268 respondents. The most popular treatment time was 60 minutes with 964 respondents or (98.67%). 360 (36.96%) of respondents raised their rates less than 6 months ago with the rate of inflation -794 (82.79%) and increased expenses -790 (82.38%) being the most popular reasons to raise fees. The largest number of respondents, 761 (79.35%), said they usually raise their fees by \$5 - \$10.

For those who charge a cancellation fee, the most popular answer was that they do not charge a fee at the first cancelled or missed appointment; full appointment fee is charged at subsequent cancelled/missed appointments 317 (35.90%). 91-100 received the highest response percentage (10.83) when asked how many hours RMTs typically work in a month. When asked to provide their monthly expenses, the largest expense range was 1001-2000 at 198 respondents.

The majority of respondents said they do not offer special discounts for those in special need 512 (53.11%), and 348 (36.1%) indicated it would depend on the situation. When asked how respondents pay for their primary work, the largest number of respondents, 259 (37.59%), chose a split percentage without a cap.

When asked what the greatest challenge in making adequate income, 209 (24.56%) respondents chose professional fees (e.g. continuing education, professional liability insurance, CMTO registration).




